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There have been countless adaptations of Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, but none quite like this new opera. This semi-autobiographical opera metaphorically reflects the experiences of the composer as a late-diagnosed autistic woman.

Alice, connecting deeply to nature, struggles to find her place in this world. Following the song of the trees, she falls into Wonderland, set as a Jungian dive deep into her psyche. Wonderland is filled with awe, mystery, cruelty, friendship, and just enough questions that force Alice to continue to discover exactly who she is as she discovers that it is in finding this out that she will set herself and all of Wonderland free.
